(*This is due—in no small part—to our presence at the Monthly Precinct Meetings. And, asking for police presence at these dangerous roadways.**)

- On Thursday, February 16 Officer Sammy Johnson went out to the Deep Wells entrance (6921 Hwy 100) for about an hour yesterday afternoon and again this morning. Here are the results of his enforcement: **18 Vehicle stops, 2 Warnings, 15 Speed violations, and 1 Other violation**.
- Lauren Balmer reports: "I've was on HWY 100 yesterday and today. Each day metro police were there. Today I pulled over to thank the officer on duty. Things are happening."
- A couple of days later Lauren Balmer was on Highway 100: "They are again sitting and ticketing exactly where they have been asked to be. Anything I've (we've) asked them to do they are doing and repetitively. Commander Lee A. Kendall of the West Precinct has been very responsive."
- Vaughn's Gap Road and Percy Warner Dr. have been selected for traffic calming measures, based on traffic volume, speeding, and previous auto crashes on the street.

"I talked with NDOT yesterday about another Traffic Calming strategy — c<u>ross walks</u>. Our committee could identify potential crosswalk locationss in close proximity to schools and parks; pull together studies and stats to show just cause; and provide me the Report & Request. I will submit them for review and enaction. I would love to see this happen."

Setup Committees to address PROBLEMS

- 1) PROBLEM: Speeding/observing traffic laws
 - SOLUTION: Positive reinforcement (along with police enforcement) Calling drivers to higher awareness. Some ideas include: Posting signs along neighborhood streets: "This is a walking neighborhood."
 - SOLUTION: Establish a relationship with West Precinct, attend meetings
 - OTHER SOLUTION(s): 1) Paint Bike Lanes, Walker Stripes, and the speed limit on streets, 2) Rumble Strips/ Audible deterrent, 3) Reflector Strips,
 4) Neighborhood Legislation, 5) Signage, 6) Electronic Speed Warning Signs, 7) Speed Humps, 8) Report all crashes
- 2) PROBLEM: Need more sidewalks and lighting
 - SOLUTION: Learn more on the sidewalk endowment
- 3) PROBLEM: Intersections
 - SOLUTION: Plastic Columns/Tubes
- 4) PROBLEM: Pedestrian Safety bicyclers and walkers
 - SOLUTION: Safety Awareness: Hold pedestrians accountable too: wearing appropriate clothing after sunset; walking on the correct side of the street, facing oncoming traffic
 - SOLUTION: Sidewalks

- SOLUTION: Landscape signage / road graphics
- 5) PROBLEM: Crime /Car Break-Ins
 - SOLUTION(s): 1) Education, 2) Report all crimes, 3) Awareness: locking car & removing valuables, guns, etc
 - SOLUTION: Establish a relationship with West Precinct, attend meetings
- 6) PROBLEM: Road Blockage due to construction, renovation and demolition
 - SOLUTION: 1) Letters from Neighborhood associations/organizations, 2)
 Report all blockage violations
- 7) PROBLEM: Who are the Authorities in charge of Law Enforcement, Policy and Management that impact our community
 - SOLUTION: Identify, research, and establish relationship
 - TDOT, NDOT, City of Nashville / HUB Nashville, Davidson County, Law Enforcement, Policy Management
 - SOLUTION: provide case studies, exhibits, and documentation of problems outlined above
- 8) PROBLEM: Impaired visibility at Intersections / overgrown hedges/vegetation
 - SOLUTION: Identify and contact HUB Nashville
- 9) QUESTION: How do we stay on track, in touch, and engaged?
 - ANSWER: Communication: Create CommunalCommunications among neighbors within each Precinct. Share information on suspicious cars, speeding cars, and cars that are indifferent to the safety of pedestrians, bicyclists, and other drivers. For example: ePublic Safety Bulletin Board with the latest news and links on committee projects and solutions
 - ANSWER: Attend meetings and read minutes
 - ANSWER: Spread the word and our team's mission: Share what we are doing with neighbors / get feedback and engagement
 - ANSWER: As you dive into the PROBLEM and implement the SOLUTION you <u>might</u> run into some bureaucracy, you <u>might</u> run into delays, you <u>might</u>

run into frustrations...

- Hopefully not, but if so, that is useful too. Bring it to the table and share. That experience is useful data to support the severity of the problem and the validity of the solution, when presented to Thom Druffel and Metro Council. ALL gathered info can be used as data
- The ePublic Safety Bulletin Board could also be used to collect letters from concerned and supportive neighbors.
